

What is a **COMPREHENSIVE TRANSITION PROGRAM (CTP)?**

An individualized program through a college or university approved by the U.S. Department of Education Federal Student Aid that allows students with Intellectual Disabilities an opportunity to work toward a career goal of gainful employment.



Individually planned supports and services include:



**Academic classes
(for credit or audit)**

Integrated work experiences/internships

CTP Facts

- Students with disabilities may enroll with a standard high school diploma, an Alternative High School Diploma, or no diploma at all.
- Financial Assistance is available (Pell Grants, Work/Study, KEES).
- Course modifications can include alternate class work and readings, alternate demonstrations of student learning, and modified testing formats.
- CTPs are typically two-year programs leading to a University credential.
